ORDER

These Revision Applications have been filed by the below mentioned Applicants against orders in Appeal passed Commissioner of Customs (Appeals), Cochin appearing against their names.

- 2. Since a common issue is involved in all these Revision Applications and as they are being represented by the same advocate Shri Palanikumar, these Revision Applications are being disposed by a common order.
- 3. All of the above mentioned Applicants are Sri Lankan nationals. They all arrived at Cochin International Airport on various dates from Colombo, Sri Lanka.

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They were all intercepted on their arrival at the Cochin International Airport by the Customs officers and search of their baggage and person resulted in the recovery of assorted gold articles and jewelry. The impugned gold articles and jewelry were not declared by the Applicants as required under Section 77 of the Customs Act, 1962. After due process of the law the Original Adjudication Authority ordered absolute confiscation of the impugned goods under Section 111 (d), (l), (m) and (o) of the Customs Act read with Section 3 (3) and also imposed penalty under Section 112 (a) of the Customs Act, 1962. The Orders in Original were all passed by The Commissioner of Customs, Air Customs, Cochin.

- 4. Aggrieved by the said orders of the lower authority, the Applicants filed appeals before the Commissioner of Customs (Appeals), Cochin. The Commissioner (Appeals) in his orders, in all the above cases, observed that the impugned orders have been passed by the Commissioner (Customs) and therefore it has gone beyond the purview of the Commissioner (Appeals) as per the provisions of section 128(1) of the Customs Act 1962. In view of the above all the impugned Appeals were rejected without going into the merits of the case.
- 5. Government has carefully gone through the facts of the case. Government observes that the impugned cases have not been adjudicated on merits at the Appellate stage. The cases have been adjudicated by an Officer at the level of the Commissioner, thus placing them out of the purview of the Commissioner (Appeals). This has resulted in a denial of an opportunity of fair play and justice to the Applicants at the Appellate level/stage. In addressing the said issue the Government therefore opines, that the said cases need to be re-adjudicated by the Appropriate authority at the Original Adjudication Authority level. The impugned Orders in Appeal therefore need to be set aside.
- 6. In light of observations made in foregoing para, The impugned Orders-in-Appeal herein are set aside. Government, in the interest of fair play and natural justice orders that all the cases be remanded back to the original adjudicating authority of the rank of Joint/Additional Commissioner for consideration afresh by the appropriate authority. The matter is remanded for denovo proceedings on

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the terms mentioned supra. The Original Adjudicating Authority shall pass the speaking orders after following the principles of natural justice within 8 weeks from the receipt of this order.

- The Revision Applications listed above are thus disposed of in terms of 7. above.
- 8. So, ordered.
